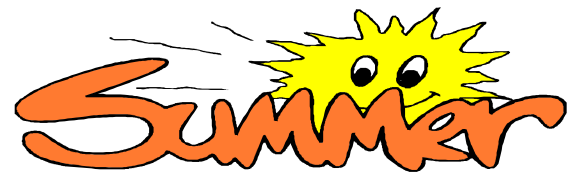

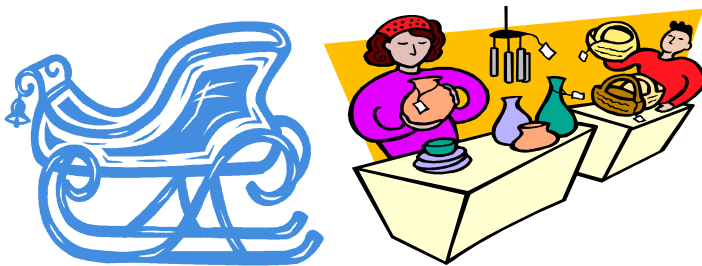
Well it is almost that time again for our annual **TAG SALE** so empty those closets, drawers, and cellars and bring your items to the church to be sold at the tag sale.

- Printer cartridges create over 1.9 billion pounds of non-biodegradable waste in our landfills

**The New York Annual Conference, through the grace of God, embodies a beloved community of hope, building up a healthy body of Christ, with heart-warmed United Methodists in mission for the transformation of the world.**

### **A Report from the 212<sup>th</sup> Session of the New York Annual Conference.**

Annual Conference was held on June 8-11 at Hofstra University in Hempstead, NY. The theme was: For Such a Time as This We Are Heart Warmed United Methodists in Mission.

Wednesday started with registration and the Laity Session. The Laity Session had as its theme "Surprised By The Spirit". After welcoming words from each of the District Lay Leaders, there were short presentations on the ways that the Spirit is present in our lives. The Connecticut District presented "The Spirit of Intercession." Following the presentations the nominees for Lay Delegates and Lay Alternates were introduced to the body.

The Wednesday evening session started off with the election of a new Conference Secretary Frederick Jackson. The worship featured Bishop Park preaching on the topic of "Blessed Assurance." The Session closed with a demonstration of the electronic voting system that was to be used in the election of delegates.

The Thursday morning session started with an opening prayer by our District Superintendent Ken Kieffer. Thursday's activities included a memorial service for clergy, clergy spouses and children as well as lay members of Annual Conference who have died since last Annual Conference.

Later, the Corporate Session included reports from the Board of Trustees, Finance and Administration, and Board of Pensions. During the afternoon, all delegates were divided among 7 legislative sections (previously selected by each delegate) to discuss and vote on the many petitions submitted to Annual Conference by individual local churches or committees associated with New York Annual Conference. Topics included such diverse matters as conference camps;; same sex marriage; pensions and health benefits for clergy.

During the evening, there was a "Jubilee Celebration" honoring those who are retiring from active ministry. There were 18 retirees honored.

Friday morning started with a breakfast for the Connecticut District. The breakfast gave everyone a chance to get to know each other and to find out what's happening in our District. The morning session included balloting and reports from many groups within the Annual Conference including: Lay Leaders, Bishops' Cabinet, pensions and nominating. The report of the Bishop's Cabinet is usually interesting but not one that people leave the hall talking about. This year it was given by our District Superintendent Rev. Ken Kieffer. In typical Ken Kieffer fashion he wowed the assembly and elevated the "Report of the Bishop's Cabinet" to one of the highlights of the Conference. Bishop Jeremiah J. Park also addressed the conference.

During the afternoon results of Thursday's legislative sessions were considered by the full delegation. We voted yes or no to the recommendations of the legislative sections regarding all the petitions considered. Some of the petitions elicited lots of discussion, both pro and con, yet, despite the strong feelings on many issues, everyone remembered that they were a Christian and the whole session was quite civil.

Friday evening included the Celebration of Ministry. A service of Commissioning, Ordination and Recognition. During this service, commissioning and recognition of four local pastors, one provisional deacon, seven provisional elders, two associate members took place. In addition, nine individuals were ordained. Bishop Violet L. Fisher presented the message. Bishop Fisher's powerful preaching left the building vibrating with the power of the Holy Spirit. A business session was held after the "Service of Ministry".

Saturday was quite a day. The morning was devoted a celebration of missions. An additional 1,500 people showed up for the celebration. Each Church was asked to highlight their mission work with their banner. Thomas Kemper, general secretary of the General Board of Global Ministries urged the gathering to embrace the UMC's focus on being in ministry with" the poor, stressing the word "with."

“He said that “John Wesley worked to move families away from the idea of simple charity to a place where they could become empowered to become self-sustaining.” During the session Bishop Park came out and did 130 push-ups as part of his effort to raise money for missions.

Throughout the Conference the laity and the clergy voted on ballot after ballot for delegates and alternates to General Conference and Jurisdictional Conference

It was an honor and an education to be your representatives at Conference this year.

## It's a Wonderful Life

On my way to Annual Conference there was stop and go construction on 684. I couldn't take my favorite bridge as it was deemed to be the most unsafe bridge in the United States. I also took the wrong exit and started driving on a north shore local road. I tried to get in the spirit, so I figured an island was the best place to get lost. I mean, if I kept driving, I was bound to get there. I stopped at a Starbuck's, back tracked, and arrived at registration an hour later than I expected. With no time to unpack or have lunch, I went straight to the Laity Session. I kept telling myself this was about faith.

I entered the arena a bit bedraggled. I looked around for Mitch. We usually sit in the front row center aisle seats. Imagine my surprise to see him on the dais as the next Lay Leader speaker! I would see him there two more times.

Once he would assist our District Superintendent giving communion to the delegates, and another time he, again, would

represent Conference Lay Leaders. Every four years we elect delegates to go to General Conference. The difficulty is that almost all of those running are super qualified. One works at the Yale Divinity School. One has done mission work in Africa and South America. Another knows Robert's Rules of order inside and out – a good thing if there is an amendment to the amendment. Others have a Master of Divinity degree. So it takes many rounds of voting to get a consensus. This year, however, we were aided by a wireless keypad, which only takes seconds to record.




There were several dynamic speakers and moving singers, but, mostly, I realized I was starting to know my way around. I corrected the registration aide who told me to park near the student cafeteria. I asked if it would be better to park in the large, empty back parking lot that was not under construction. If I didn't know the directions to the Connecticut breakfast, which constantly changes, I knew who to ask. I could help new delegates-and some who were not so new, but still confused.

Budget cuts had hit the Conference. There were fewer Hallelujah Choruses and people dancing around the aisles. A lot of money went to the high tech wireless key pads used for efficient voting.

As I drove home, I found my self singing: “Lift high the cross, the love of Christ proclaim, Till all the world adore his sacred Name.” I realized some thing happens at Annual Conference – that “X” factor. It wasn't the Bishop's sermon or the session that ended an hour after the buses stopped so I had to walk across the campus to the dorm at 11:30 pm. It was that for four days I was enmeshed in Christian community, a safe sanctuary. People don't cut, bully, or steal. Two strangers become best-est friends for ninety six hours. People say; “Please”, “Thank You”, and “May I Help You?” It gets under the skin. It nurtures the soul. All I can say is, it give those 1930 and 1940 MGM Jimmy Stewart movies competition. It's a wonderful life!
